mentary evidence of its rich cultural heritage. There is a beautiful convergence between the past that Coomarswarmy celebrated and the future symbolized by the new Performing Arts Theatre. The fact that a principal road of Colombo is named after Ananda K. Coomaraswamy ensures that the generations to come will continue to be aware of this preeminent intellectual and scholar, and commemorate his outstanding contribution to the island. Removing his name from this street is an irrevocable loss for all of us, and it cannot be allowed to happen.
